He stated that the parking lot for this business is 40 feet from their front doors. There have been two businesses there before this business, one being McKenna's, which they had an outdoor patio blaring their music. The other was Arena's, who had motorcycle nights and motorcycles drove up and down the street at all hours of the night. It was unbearable. There is a big concern for outdoor entertainment. Tabor Street is a very narrow street and emergency vehicles cannot get down the street. He asked that the Committee take into consideration the residents' needs and concerns and deny outdoor entertainment. The residents are not opposed to indoor entertainment, but not outdoor.

Mr. Richards stated that as to entertainment, he would like to have indoor, but he would not want to limit that to just indoor.

City Clerk indicated to the Route Slip and stated that the Traffic Engineer Report states "no outdoor activities".

Nicholas Hemond, Esq., appeared to represent applicant and stated that he met with the Solicitor earlier and discussed this matter. He stated that with him, this evening, is Eric Bouchard, Civic Engineer, and he would like Mr. Bouchard to go in and examine the property and do some field tests of decibel readings. He suggested a temporary approval of the Entertainment License with condition Mr. Bouchard monitor the noise and make his findings to the applicant and report back to the Committee.

Solicitor stated that he had a conversation with the Attorney prior to this meeting. He would not be opposed to meet with Attorney Hemond and discuss in exploring the alternative, which seems to be reasonable. If the Committee considers this alternative, there has to be something put in place that in the meantime the problem does not persist.

Councilmember Hopkins stated that he would like to hear from some of the neighbors that are present this evening.

Chair stated that he would also like to hear from Mr. Bouchard.

Public Speakers:

John Saviano appeared to speak and stated that his girlfriend owns property right across from the bike path for the past six years and she has rented the property and there has been nothing but complaints since the tenants moved in last August.

Playing loud music without a Public Entertainment license

Lawrence Celani, 121 Massachusetts St., appeared to speak and stated that the problems have been going on from at least since October and he made a complaint. He then received a call from the Constituent Affairs Director stating that this business was operating without a license. Before the holidays, the applicant agreed not to play music until he obtained his Entertainment License. He broke that agreement. He does not trust him. He is against granting a temporary license.

Paul Celani, 111 Massachusetts St., appeared to speak and stated that these problems are affecting the quality of life.

Councilmember Stycos asked how long this business has been operating and holding public entertainment without a license. Attorney Hemond stated that renovations were done in October. It seems like the problem is the new sound system. It seems the neighbors are saying this has been a problem since October.

Lawrence Celani stated that the problem has been going on for three years. The neighbors have been tolerating it, but since the end of August, it has gotten out of control.

Councilmember Hopkins stated that he is aggravated about this whole situation. For three years, the applicant has been circumventing the Public Entertainment License. He is not a good neighbor and he does not deserve a license.

City Clerk stated that the liquor license for this business was approved September 10, 2018 and applicant was asked at that time, if he was going to have entertainment. He stated on the record that there would be no entertainment besides a DJ and at that time, she informed him that if he was going to have a DJ, he needed an Entertainment License.

Solicitor stated that what the Committee has done so far, does not constitute a hearing. If the Committee wants to take some sort of action, the Committee needs to take testimony by hearing from the Attorney and his client and from the Police Department. After properly hearing testimony, then the Committee can take some sort of action or make a decision.

Attorney Hemond stated that he is trying to offer the Committee a solution.

Council Vice-President Favicchio questioned if the applicant has a Public Entertainment License. Attorney Hemond stated, no, he does not. Council Vice-President Favicchio questioned why this Committee should treat this business differently when we just, a few minutes ago, asked someone who is doing Auto Repair without a license to apply tomorrow for a license. Attorney Hemond stated that he is not suggesting that he be treated differently, he is offering a solution.

Council President Farina questioned if the issue is music or entertainment. He also stated that he has no issue with having the Engineer look into this for next month, but he does not think voting on this this evening makes sense.

Playing loud music without a Public Entertainment license

Councilmember Vargas asked what the hours of operation are. Mouayad Alkabouni, applicant, stated 8-1, seven days a week with no cover charge. Councilmember Vargas stated that she has no problem with what Council President Farina stated, but she has a problem with the music and if the applicant is exceeding the hours, especially during the week. She asked Police Department if there have been any problems or any calls of complaints since this business has been in operation. Major Quirk stated that Officers were dispatched two particular weekends in December, December 6 & 7 and 13 & 14. On December 6th, Officer noted large crowd and loud music. On December 7th, Officer observed DJ on site and stayed until 11:45. Officer's opinion was music was excessively loud. The Officer approached the business owner to indicate this to him and was told that he was in the process of doing renovations to address the noise issue. The following week, Officers went to the establishment again and found music to be loud when doors were open.

Attorney Hemond stated that he thinks there is a way that allows this to work for everybody.

Chair asked Mr. Bouchard to address the Committee on how he would approach issues like this.

Eric Bouchard appeared to speak and stated that most of the time, the issue is not the decibel issue. the problem is more or less the base frequencies. What he did with a business he worked on in the past with such issues, is have the speakers taken off the floor and hang them from the ceilings. Another thing that could be done is attach a mixer to the DJ area. He also stated that what is needed is objective data on the actual noise level in the neighborhood.

Council Vice-President Favicchio asked Mr. Bouchard if he would do the study in the evening. Mr. Bouchard stated that when he does a study like this, he would custom fit a program study for that location.

Councilmember Stycos asked Attorney Hemond if his client is violating the Law by having a DJ without an Entertainment License. Attorney Hemond stated that his client declines to answer that question with a right to a hearing. Councilmember Stycos asked Attorney Hemond if his client denies operating after 1 a.m. on at least one occasion. Attorney Hemond stated that his client denies operating after hours.

Council Vice-President Favicchio stated that he does not object to a continuance with some voluntary restrictions.

Councilmember Hopkins stated that this Committee has fined Waste Haulers for coming into the City before hours disturbing the peace of the residents. This is the same analogy. To him, this may be a fineable offense similar to the way we have fined the trucks. Solicitor stated that if it is established, but only after proper proceedings, such as testimony from the Police and cross examinations and establishing presence of a DJ.

Councilmember Hopkins stated that if this is not fixed by next month and the residents are back here, he will introduce an Ordinance of a hefty fine.

Solicitor suggested continuing both the Show Cause Hearing and the Public Entertainment License application.

Councilmember Stycos agreed with statements made by Councilmember Hopkins.

On motion by Council President Farina, seconded by Council Vice-President Favicchio, it was voted to continue the Public Entertainment License application for one month on condition that applicant reduce noise to ambien level during hours of operation and hours 8-11 Wednesdays, Thursdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays. City Clerk asked for clarification of closing only on Wednesday and Thursdays? Council President said no 11 p.m. closing for all nights.

Under Discussion:

Councilmember Vargas questioned what the Police can do if they receive complaints and applicant violates this motion. Solicitor stated that the Police do not have authority to shut the business down. If they violate multiple times between now and next month, the Committee would have to Show Cause applicant again with notice given.

Roll call was taken on above motion to continue the Public Entertainment License application and motion passed unanimously.

On motion by Council President Farina, seconded by Council Vice-President Favicchio, it was voted to continue the Show Cause Hearing. Motion passed unanimously.

Chair stated that the reason for this Show Cause is the applicant has had more than 11 cars on the lot. Mr. Florentino stated that he has moved the cars from the lot.

Chair indicated that the Inspector also noticed the cars have no plates on them. Mr. Florentino stated that he works for dealers and they sometimes bring cars for two days or so to be repaired.

On motion by Council President Farina, seconded by Councilmember Vargas, it was voted to remove this item from the agenda. Motion passed unanimously.

Prospero Castro appeared to speak.

Chair stated reason for Show Cause is the hours of operation and vehicle restrictions. He stated that the Auto Repair License was approved with hours of operation to be Mondays thru Saturdays 8-6 and vehicles were not to be parked on the street and restricted to eight vehicles.

Councilmember Vargas asked applicant what the current hours of operation are. Mr. Castro stated that he just rented the business to Jose Garcia and he explained to him the hours and how many cars he was to have on the lot. Now, he has less than eight cars.

Council Vice-President Favicchio asked Mr. Castro if he provided a lease to the City Clerk for approval. Mr. Castro stated, no, he did not. Council Vice-President Favicchio asked Solicitor's opinion on this, since Mr. Castro was issued the license and now another person is operating under that license. Solicitor stated that the problem is when the license was granted, it was granted to Mr. Castro individually and background check was conducted on him. By doing what he did, he is circumventing the requirement because the Committee does not know who this gentleman is. He indicated to Mr. Castro that he cannot have this person operate this business unless he is the person doing the repairs and this gentleman works for him as an employee.

Chair stated that the Mr. Garcia can apply for the Auto Repair License under his name, but in the meantime, he cannot operate under the current license.

City Clerk stated that she can provide the application to Mr. Garcia this evening so he can fill it out and file it in her office tomorrow.

On motion by Council President Farina, seconded by Council Vice-President Favicchio, it was voted to continue this Show Cause to next month's meeting for follow-up. Motion passed unanimously.
